11. In Matthew 6:9-10, when we pray, "Our Father Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy Name, Thy Kingdom come", we are praying for the coming of the Kingdom of Heaven.
12. Luke 18:17 Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child shall in no wise enter therein.
13. 1 Cor 4:20 For the Kingdom of God is not in word but in deed.
14. In Matthew 28:18, all power in Heaven and Earth has been given to Jesus. As His ambassadors, we have been given this power to preach the Gospel and to establish the Kingdom of Heaven as His ambassadors on earth. Is this statement **True** or **False**?
