

Offensive Weapons in Spiritual Warfare

A. Your Spiritual Foundation

1. The Sword of the Spirit – The Word of God.
2. The Name of Jesus (Acts 3:16).
3. Water.
4. The Blood of Jesus:
 - a. covers (sprinkles) our bodies and possessions (Heb 9:21; 10:19; 12:24; 1Pet 1:2).
 - b. cleanses sin (1 John 1:7).
 - c. speaks (Heb 12:24).
5. Anointing Oil – The Power of the Holy Spirit.
6. Confessing your sins.
7. Communion.

B. Prayers

1. Prayer of Faith (Mark 11:24).
2. Anointing with Oil (James 5:14,15).
3. Prayer of Agreement (Matt 18:19).
4. Prayer of Authority (John 14:14; Mark 16:15-18).
5. Binding and Loosing (Matt 18:18).
6. Prayer of Affirmation (Heb 10:23; Rev 12:11).
7. Special Prayers:
 - a. Breaking Curses.
 - b. Establishing the Kingdom of God and staying in the KOG.
 - c. Three Witnesses (1 John 5:7-8).
 - d. Doing Personal Cleansing.
 - e. Overcome Mind Control Spirits by staying in the KOG.

C. Dealing with Curses, Demons and Evil Spirits

1. Casting out demons and devils; and washing out evil spirits:
 - a. out of a person.
 - b. out of a home or location or city or country.
 - c. out of a specific geographical area.
 - d. into a dry place.
 - e. into a watery place.
 - f. into the pit.
2. Breaking soul ties with people, places, objects, sins, demons, devils and evil spirits.
3. Breaking curses, covenants, contracts, vows, etc.

D. Lifestyle Healing Behavior

1. Healing Methods:
 - a. Praise and Worship.
 - b. Praying in tongues a lot (Jude 20).
 - c. Fasting (Isaiah 58:6-14).
 - d. Clapping (Ezek 21:14).
 - e. Lifting up holy hands (1 Tim 2:8).
 - f. Kneeling before the Lord.

3. Daily Scenarios for Spiritual Warfare. Sem 2.

E. Ministry Guidelines

1. Minister with authority because all power is available to you in the Name of Jesus.
2. Minister according to the leading of the Holy Spirit.
3. Minister deliverance and cleansing not so much based on what Jesus did but more based on what He said (i.e., taught).
 - a. When Jesus ministered, satan was not yet defeated.
 - b. When Jesus ministered, no one was yet born again.
 - c. When Jesus ministered, it was rare, if ever, that the person with the demon had previously been cleansed of that demon (i.e., it was a first time “casting out” event). Today, it is quite common to have a subject out of whom the same demon (or demon type) had been previously cast out but has been permitted to return. Often, the cycle has been repeated not just once but on multiple occasions.
 - d. Jesus was not casting demons out of Christians.
